

- The regional unemployment rate was 2.9 percent in April 2024, lower than the statewide rate of 3.3 percent.
- The last time the regional rate was higher than the statewide rate was in 2005

Over-the-Year Labor Force Growth Rate Florida and CareerSource Okaloosa Walton Region




- Over the past 12 months, the regional labor force growth rate was 2.3 percent, faster than the statewide growth rate of 1.4 percent
- Key contributors to labor force growth in 2023:
 - Population growth (specifically in-migration)
 - re-entrants to the labor force










Targeted Industries: Healthcare and Social Assistance








Targeted Industries: Public Administration

Crestview-Fort Walton Beach-Destin MSA - Local Government








Targeted Industries: Construction

Crestview-Fort Walton Beach-Destin MSA - Manufacturing




Online Job Advertisements




- Online Job Advertisements in the region peaked in March 2023 at 6,509
